#### 1. Situational task:

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#### **Situational tasks:**

- 1. Shang Yang, an ancient Chinese thinker, founder of the school of legalists, repeatedly emphasized that in an exemplary governed state there should be many punishments and few rewards. "Therefore, in states striving for dominion in the Celestial Empire, every nine punishments corresponds to one reward, and in states doomed to dismemberment, every nine rewards corresponds to one punishment." Which state, in your opinion, will be more stable: the one with a lot of punishments, or the one with a lot of rewards? What connection exists between rewards and punishments, on the one hand, and the welfare and stability of the state, on the other?
- 2. The ancient Greek philosopher Socrates argued that "kings and rulers are not those who wear a scepter or are chosen by anyone, or who received power by lot or by violence or deceit, but those who know how to rule." By what criteria, according to the ancient political tradition, were those who knew how to govern determined?
- 3. When a friend tried to persuade Socrates, who was sentenced to death, to escape from prison, he was refused with the words: "I consider it obligatory for everyone to obey the laws unquestioningly and unswervingly." In another era, in another country, the Russian political thinker B.A. Kistyakovsky said that law-abiding characterizes not a legal state, but a police state. What do you think: is it necessary to always obey all laws? Give reasons for your point of view.
- 4. Aristotle distinguished between two types of justice: equalizing justice and distributive justice. How are these two types of justice different? According to what principle should be carried out, according to Aristotle, the distribution of goods in society? And how applicable is this principle of distribution today?
- 5. Why did the ancient thinkers Plato and Aristotle oppose democracy as a form of government? How to understand Plato's statement that it is freedom that destroys democracy, "democracy becomes intoxicated with freedom"?

#### Debate #1. Elite privilege: is it fair?

In many countries, the political elite has some privileges. They concern the provision of VIPs with certain services and material goods. For them, special waiting rooms are created at train stations, separate seats on trains and planes, special services in medical institutions, special traffic regimes on highways, etc.

Is it fair to make an exception for someone in a democratic society? What are the arguments for and against privilege?

#### **Debate #2. Fight against corruption.**

As options for solving the problem, the following can be proposed: tightening control and punishment, the inevitability of punishment, increasing salaries for officials (as a result, interest in maintaining their place), freedom of the media (transparency of the activities of officials, their powers and the possibility of abuse), strengthening the private sector.

#### **Group work: Leadership qualities**

The study group lasts into two subgroups. The task is to, through a joint discussion, identify the character traits that a modern leader should have. Using a Whatman paper, students should write down seven character traits in priority order. A representative from each group makes a presentation. The results of the work done are written on the board. During the preparation process, "psychological assistance" in the form of a set of various personality traits, offered below, can be used as auxiliary material.
