Appendix 1

The criterion for the implementation and assessment of the SIW:

1. An essay is a short written work that presents the student's knowledge and individual position on a given issue.

Recommendations for work essays:

- 1. Choice of utterance
- 2. Definition of the problem of the statement.
- 3. Formulation of the main idea of the statement
- 4. Determination of your position to the statement
- 5. Argumentation of one's own opinion
- 6. Argumentation should be carried out on two levels:
- 1. Theoretical level it is based on philosophical knowledge (concepts, terms, contradictions, directions of scientific thought, relationships, as well as the opinions of scientists, thinkers).
- 2. Empirical level two options are possible here: using examples from social practice and events in society; appeal to personal experience.
- 7. Conclusion

Execution criterion:

- 1. Carefully read the assignment: the essay must have a direct answer to the question posed.
- 2. Make an essay plan.

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- 3. Content should be consistent and well-reasoned.
- 4. Completely exclude plagiarism from your essay, essays are a product of purely personal creativity.
- 5. Laconic, the volume of the essay is clearly defined in the instructions

One paragraph - one thesis. One sentence, one thought.

Essay structure:

The main part - (2-3 paragraphs, be clear, support the main ideas with facts, vivid descriptions)

Comparison table structure:

- 1. Read the text.
- 2. Select keywords, phrases.
- 3. Arrange keywords or phrases in chronological, logical order.
- 4. Present the prepared material in the form of a comparative table.

Helps to organize information, draw parallels between phenomena, events or facts. This table looks simple: The middle column is called the "comparison line". It lists the categories by which we assume to compare some phenomena, events, facts. The columns located on either side of the "comparison line" contain information that is to be compared.
