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12. Discipline's policy

Requirements for learners, attendance, behavior, grading policy, penalties, etc.

Requirements for learners:

1. Learners must complete tasks daily according to the schedule of lectures, practical classes and SIWT classes.

2. Have an idea about the topic of the upcoming lecture, be prepared for feedback at the lecture.

3. Learners should participate in discussions, complete individual and group assignments, research and other resources.

4. Learners should keep track of due dates for assignments.

5. Do not miss all types of classes without good reason.

6. Perform SIW according to the schedule specified in the program.

7. All types of written work of students are checked for plagiarism.

8. The final rating of admission to the exam in the discipline must be at least 50 points (60%)

9. If you miss each lecture session, the score for midterm control is reduced by 1 point, if you miss each session of the SIWT, the score for the SIW is reduced by 2 points.

10. When calculating the final rating, penalty points for missed lectures and SIWs are deducted from points for foreign control.

11. In the context of distance learning, the main information platform is the Platonus automated information

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system (hereinafter referred to as AIS Platonus). The main monitoring of the educational process is carried out in this system. The tasks are completed by students only in the AIS Platonus. Additionally, it is possible to use online classes using various information platforms Zoom, Webex, WhatsApp, etc.

12. When conducting an online conference in the distance learning format, the attendance of learners is taken into account based on the video broadcast from the account of each of the learners. In the absence of constant visual contact with the learner, the teacher fixes the absence of the lesson for an unexcused reason.

13. When conducting an online conference in the distance learning format, the learner must comply with the requirements for a neat appearance and not disrupt the course of the lesson.

14. Learners must complete assignments daily according to the schedule of lectures, laboratory classes and SIWT, follow the deadlines for submitting assignments (in terms of DOT).
