### 12. Discipline Policy

Requirements for students:

- 1. Students must complete tasks daily according to the schedule of lectures, practical classes and PSRO classes.
- 2. Have an idea of the topic of the upcoming lecture, be ready for feedback at the lecture.
- 3. Students should participate in discussions, complete individual and group assignments, and explore other resources.
- 4. Students must follow the deadlines for submitting assignments.
- 5. Do not miss all types of classes without good reason.
- 6. Perform SRO according to the schedule specified in the program.
- 7. All types of written works of students are checked for plagiarism.
- 8. In case of missing each lecture session, the score of the midterm control is reduced by 1 point, in case of missing each PSOP lesson, the score for the SRO is reduced by 2 points.
- 9. When calculating the final rating, penalty points for missed lectures and SROs are deducted from the points for foreign control.
- 10. Students must complete tasks daily according to the schedule of lectures, laboratory classes and PSSOs, monitor the deadlines for the submission of tasks.

**Penalties:** In case of missing one lecture session without a valid reason, the penalty point is 1 point (missed lectures in the form of penalty points are deducted from the grades of the midterm control (absences of PSROP classes in the form of penalty points are deducted from the SRO grades). For being late, improper behavior during the lesson, damage to the property of the department, using a cell phone during the lesson, 0.5 points are deducted. For late defense of the SRO, 20% is removed, in case of passing the SRO during the weeks of the RC, 50% is removed.

**Incentive measures:** For active participation in the educational process (participation in impiads, research papers, conferences), 0.5 points are added to the mid-term control in the cipline.
